

Notes on the Service

The Feast of the Holy Name

Num 6:22-27 • Ps 8 • Phil 2:5-11 • Lk 2:15-21

From the 6th c. churches observed a feast eight days after Christmas, for Jesus' circumcision. At the Reformation, that feast was retained and a collect written for it: "Almightie God, whiche madeste thy... sonne to be circumcised, and obedyente to the law..; Graunt us the true circumcision of the spirite, that our hertes and all our members, being mortifyed from all worldly and carnal lustes, may in all thinges obey thy blessed wil...." (sic)

In the 15th c. a separate feast of the Holy Name of Jesus had been observed on August 7. The first Prayer Book had dropped that feast, but the 1979 Prayer Book has revived it but shifted the emphasis of January 1 away from the Circumcision and to the Name, as is evident in its different collect: "Eternal Father who didst give to thine incarnate Son the holy name of Jesus to be the sign of our salvation ['sign' because Jesus, Joshua in Hebrew, means he-who-saves], plant in every heart... the love of... the Savior..." Likewise, all the scripture readings for January 1 now include mention of the Name of God or the Name of Jesus.

At the end of a chapter of ritual directions for Nazarites, people specially set aside by vows, the priestly writer of Numbers adds what has come to be called the Aaronic blessing as a way of applying God's Name to Israelites. The 1979 Prayer Book ends a Service for Evenings with it.

"Thy Name is exalted" begins and ends Psalm 8. The psalm's theme is divine glory and human dignity. Christian devotion could imagine v 2, "Out of the mouths of infants and children your majesty is praised" applying to the eight-day-old Jesus, and even to the Holy Innocents commemorated on December 28. Christian theology certainly applied vv 5-6 to Jesus, as for instance in Hebrews 2, which quotes this psalm and comments, "we do not yet see everything in subjection to [man]. But we see Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, crowned...."

Christ lowered himself from the Godhead down to the human race and then down to the bottom of human misery, crucifixion. That degradation is called by Paul, Christ's "emptying of himself." In response to that volun-tary self-humiliation, God exalted Christ's Name above all others. This passage is read also on Palm Sunday and on Holy Cross Day, observing the Atonement.

Jewish law requires every eight-day old male be circumcised and named as a son of the covenant. This observant Jew, Jesus, is given his name in the context of his birth disclosed to shepherds by angels. Despite their temporary obscurity, these revelations will prove greater than those at Sinai.
