Filled with the Holy Spirit, Stephen gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. "Look," he said, "I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!" But they covered their ears, and with a loud shout all rushed together against him. Then they dragged him out of the city and began to stone him; and the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. While they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." Then he knelt down and cried out in a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." When he had said this, he died.

Reader. The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

The Second Reading

1 Peter 2:2-10

Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation—if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good.

Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture:

"See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame." To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe,

"The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner",

and

"A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall."

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.

Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

John 14:1-14

Jesus said, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. And you know the way to the place where I am going." Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him."

Notes on the Service

Fifth Sunday of Easter

Acts 7:55-60 • Ps 31:1-5, 15-16 • I Pet 2:1-10 • Jn. 14:1-14

Today's collect was composed for the 1549 Prayer Book's Feast of St. Philip & St. James, May 1, which used the same passage from John for its Gospel as does today. The Way to eternal life is a key subject of the readings.

Stephen was the first Christian martyr, that is, the first to have been killed because of his faith. Unlike modern terrorists' misuse of the term, the New Testament martyr does not murder others nor take his own life. Today's reading is the climax of a chapter about Stephen's testimony to a Jerusalem crowd and the crowd's lethal reaction. Notice how Stephen's last words repeat Jesus' last words as quoted in Luke's Gospel, "into thy hand, O Lord....". First appearing here as keeper of the coats of killers, Saul will play a lead in later chapters of Acts, after the risen Christ changes him.

Psalm 31 is a lament composed by someone who was in need of protection from impending menace. It has often been used by those in extremis. "Into thy hand I commend my spirit," v 5, anticipates the dying words of both Jesus and Stephen. In Medieval devotions, words from the psalm were part of the "script" of holy dying. The last words of Francis Xavier were "in thee, O Lord, have I put my trust." (v.1)

I Peter addresses Gentiles who have come to worship Israel's God. Once they had been no people; now they are God's people, according to I Peter's paraphrase of the prophet Hosea. To reach that conclusion about their change of status, the author strings together verses from Isaiah and two psalms arguing that believers are stones of a living temple. "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation" is I Peter's restatement of God's words to Moses on Sinai, "You shall be my own possession...a kingdom of priests, a holy nation." This passage has been cited to support the doctrine of the priesthood of all believers, i.e., the doctrine that the Church as a corporate entity constitutes the priesthood, not ordained individuals by themselves. This is distinct from the priesthood of every believer, the Protestant doctrine that each single believer is his/her own priest.

As Ascension Day approaches, Gospels are from Jesus' farewell to his disciples before his arrest, but applied to the risen Christ's departure from this earth. Christ assures his followers that he is their way to God, and that whoever has seen him with faith's eyes, has seen God. "In my Father's house are many mansions..." is often read at funerals. Asking "in my name" means asking in agreement with the will of Christ the Cosmic Intercessor.
