When the apostles had come together, they asked Jesus, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? Notes on the Service

Last Sunday of Easter

Acts 1:6-14 • Ps 68:1-10,33-36 • I Pet 4:12-14 • Jn 17:1-11

Ascension Day, this past Thursday, marked the return of Christ to the Father. Referring to that exaltation of Christ, today's collect also looks forward to next Sunday's feast, Pentecost, as it asks for the Spirit, who would come to the disciples on Pentecost. In composing this collect for today, "Expectation Sunday," the 1549 Prayer Book's author used lines from a 7th century service for Ascension Eve.

The serial readings of excerpts from Acts which served as first lessons during Eastertide have ended. Today's passage reverts to the opening chapter of Acts. When the risen Christ promises his disciples the Spirit, they misconstrue him to mean that he is about to restore Judea's independence from the Roman Empire. Jesus answers it is not for them to know the date of that. Next Luke summarizes the story of Jesus' ascension, mentioning two men in white whom he had also reported at the empty tomb at Easter. Then Luke names the eleven who, together with Mary, other women, and Jesus' brothers, return to the upper room, the Cenacle, to wait for what is to come next. That will be the promised Spirit.

Psalm 68 opens with a rallying-cry used by the Israelites during their trek through Sinai. Vv 5-6 call God the help of the helpless; in vv 7-10 a thunderstorm accompanies God; vv 11-20, omitted, is a war song. The Psalm's general tone of triumph, and particularly v 18, "gone up on high," [also omitted, probably because modern translations prefer "ascend the holy mount"] and its v 34, "He rides in the heavens," make this chant, which might be from David's time, applicable to Christ's victory.

Eastertide readings from I Peter conclude today with another warning that suffering might come, and another exhortation not to suffer for crimes but for righteous acts, as did Jesus. One purpose of I Peter must have been to steel Christians for persecution or for the judgment, or both: "the fiery ordeal." A connection between this epistle and the message of Pentecost is the assurance that "the [S]pirit of glory and of God is resting upon you."

In eternity, the ascended Christ intercedes for us. Likewise, today's Gospel shows the earthly Christ interceding for his disciples on the night before his arrest. Speaking as one whose destiny is completed, Jesus says to the Father that he has "accomplished the work which thou gavest me to do....I am no longer in the world...." In John's Gospel, Christ's death is his glorification, whereas the church's ordinary liturgical observance follows Luke in seeing Christ's glorificati.
