

# The Gathering of God's People

Processional #383 Fairest Lord Jesus

<u>Greetings</u> BCP 355

Presider: Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

People: And blessed be his kingdom, now and forever. Amen.

Collect of the Day

Presider: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

*Presider*: Let us pray.

O God, who on the holy mount revealed to chosen witnesses your well-beloved Son, wonderfully transfigured, in raiment white and glistening: Mercifully grant that we, being delivered from the disquietude of this world, may by faith behold the King in his beauty; who with you, O Father, and you, O Holy Spirit, lives and reigns, one God, for ever and

ever. Amen.

### First Reading

Exodus 34:29-35

Moses came down from Mount Sinai. As he came down from the mountain with the two tablets of the covenant in his hand, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were afraid to come near him. But Moses called to them; and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses spoke with them. Afterward all the Israelites came near, and he gave them in commandment all that the Lord had spoken with him on Mount Sinai. When Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil on his face; but whenever Moses went in before the Lord to speak with him, he would take the veil off, until he came out; and when he came out, and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, the Israelites would see the face of Moses, that the skin of his face was shining; and Moses would put the veil on his face again, until he went in to speak with him.

Reader. The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

Dominus regnavit

1 [The Lord is King;

let the people tremble; \*

he is enthroned upon the cherubim;

let the earth shake.

- 2 The Lord is great in Zion; \*
  he is high above all peoples.
- 3 Let them confess his Name, which is great and awesome; \* he is the Holy One.
- 4 "O mighty King, lover of justice,
  you have established equity; \*
  you have executed justice and righteousness in
  Jacob."]

### Second Reading

2 Peter 1:13-21

I think it right, as long as I am in this body, to refresh your memory, since I know that my death will come soon, as indeed our Lord Jesus Christ has made clear to me. And I will make every effort so that after my departure you may be able at any time to recall these things. For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by human

will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

Reader. The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

Presider. The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus

Christ according to Luke.

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesuatook with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah" -not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

People: Praise to you, Lord Christ.

### Notes on the Service

# The Feast of The Transfiguration

Exo 34:29-35 • Ps 99 • II Pet 1:13-31 • Lk 9:28-36

The Transfiguration is the Feast which commemorates Christ's transformation so that his face and clothing shined, as seen by the inner circle of apostles, on a mountain top, said to be Mt Tabor. The apostles have this vision eight days after Peter had first identified Jesus as the Messiah. Now Peter's confession is being ratified by the figures and the Voice on the mountain.

Assigning a specific date to recall the Transfiguration began in Eastern Orthodox calendars before A.D. 1000. In 1457, it was added to Western calendars in by Pope Callistus III in commemor-ation of the victory, on August 6, 1456, of Christian armies led by Giovanni Capistrano, O.F.M., ("San Juan Capistrano") over Turks pushing onto Belgrade after their capture of Constantinople in 1453. The feast did not appear in the first three English Prayer Books. It entered the Episcopal calendar only in 1892 thanks to the efforts of William Reed Huntington, who wrote our collect. A hymn for this Holy Day, #137, was translated by J. M. Neale, feast day, August 7.

Exodus says Moses' face was shining after contact with God's glory on Mt Sinai. Moses' luminosity must have been a reflection of the Divine fire. This passage was notoriously mistranslated by the Latin Vulgate as Moses' having "sprouted horns," causing Michelangelo to sculpt his statue of Moses with horns on Moses' head.

A psalm about God's kingship, Psalm 99 also honors Moses and the Law. Notice the refrain in vv 3, 5, 9, "He is the Holy One." As the Holy One met Moses on Mt Sinai, so the Holy One meets worshipers of the psalmist's time on Mt Zion, in Jerusalem, the site where Jesus, too, will meet his best glory.

Il Peter refers to Peter's having witnessed Christ's Transfiguration as evidence of his teaching's authenticity in contrast with the myths found in other 2nd century writings. "This is my Son, with whom I am well pleased," is Matthew's wording of the Voice as cited by Il Peter.

Luke is the only author who times the Transfiguration at night, "Peter and those with him were heavy with sleep...." Moses and Elijah with Jesus signify agreement of Torah and prophets, respectively, with Christ. Like glowing light, clouds are another sign of God's presence. Any plan to enshrine the three figures would slow Jesus' departure. His departure is a subject which, having discussed it with his two great predecessors, Jesus begins now to emphasize increasingly to his twelve apostles.
